### A BILL ENTITLED

#### 1 AN ACT concerning

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#### Chesapeake Bay Phosphorus Reduction Act of 2011

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting low phosphorous fertilizers from being used on 4 established turf; prohibiting specialty fertilizers from being labeled for certain  $\mathbf{5}$ uses after a certain date; providing a certain exception to the prohibition; 6 requiring the Department of Agriculture, in cooperation with the University of 7 Maryland, to adopt regulations requiring certain signs to be posted where 8 specialty fertilizer is sold or distributed after a certain date; requiring the sign to contain certain information; prohibiting certain fertilizers from being sold or 9 10 distributed for use on established lawns, grass, or turf; making technical and conforming changes; and generally relating to the regulation of fertilizer. 11

## 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 23 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Agriculture

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1 In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) 2 "Low phosphorous fertilizer" means fertilizer: (p) 3 (1)Containing not more than 5% of available phosphoric acid ( $H_3PO_4$ ); 4 and That has an application rate not to exceed 0.25 pound of available  $\mathbf{5}$ (2)6 phosphoric acid  $(H_3PO_4)/1,000$  square feet/application and 0.5 pound of available phosphoric acid  $(H_3PO_4)/1,000$  square feet/year. 7 8 "Specialty fertilizer" means a commercial fertilizer distributed primarily (y) 9 for nonfarm use, such as home gardens, lawns, shrubbery, flowers, golf courses, municipal parks, cemeteries, greenhouses, and nurseries, and may include commercial 10 11 fertilizers used for any research or experimental purpose. 126 - 210.13(1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "SPECIALTY FERTILIZER" INCLUDES (e) LOW PHOSPHOROUS FERTILIZER. 14(2) 15THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO: 16**(I)** SEED STARTER FERTILIZER FOR USE ON NEWLY 17ESTABLISHED LAWNS OR TURF; OR 18 FERTILIZER USED FOR MAINTENANCE ON LAWNS, **(II)** 19GRASS, OR TURF WHEN A PHOSPHOROUS DEFICIENCY IS DEMONSTRATED BY A 20SOIL TEST. 21Except as provided in paragraph [(2)] (4) of this subsection, **[**(1)**] (3)** 22on or after April 1, 2011, a lawn fertilizer with an available phosphoric acid ( $H_3PO_4$ ) 23content greater than 5%: 24May not be labeled for use on established lawns [or], grass, (i) 25**OR TURF**; 26May not be labeled with spreader settings; and (ii) 27Shall be marked with the words "NOT FOR USE ON (iii) 28ESTABLISHED LAWNS [OR], GRASS, **OR TURF**" in at least a three-quarter inch 29font and in a legible and conspicuous manner on the front side of the container. 30 (2)This subsection does not apply to seed starter fertilizer for use on 31 newly established lawns or turf.]

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1 (4) ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 2012, A SPECIALTY FERTILIZER WITH 2 AVAILABLE PHOSPHOROUS:

3 (I) MAY NOT BE LABELED FOR USE ON ESTABLISHED 4 LAWNS, GRASS, OR TURF;

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(II) MAY NOT BE LABELED WITH SPREADER SETTINGS; AND

6 (III) SHALL BE MARKED WITH THE WORDS "NOT FOR USE 7 ON ESTABLISHED LAWNS, GRASS, OR TURF" IN AT LEAST A 8 THREE-QUARTER INCH FONT AND IN A LEGIBLE AND CONSPICUOUS MANNER ON 9 THE FRONT SIDE OF THE CONTAINER.

10 (5) (I) BY APRIL 1, 2012, THE DEPARTMENT, IN COOPERATION 11 WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS REQUIRING 12 THE POSTING OF A SIGN AT ANY LOCATION WHERE SPECIALTY FERTILIZER IS 13 OFFERED FOR SALE OR DISTRIBUTED.

(II) THE SIGN REQUIRED UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF
THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL CONTAIN INFORMATION, BASED ON GUIDELINES
ADOPTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND, THAT GUIDES CONSUMERS ON
THE PROPER USE OF LAWN CARE PRODUCTS TO REDUCE POLLUTION IN THE
CHESAPEAKE BAY AND OTHER WATERS OF THE STATE.

20 (a) (1) [Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, on or after 21 April 1, 2011, a person may not sell or distribute for use or sale at a retail 22 establishment in the State any fertilizer intended for use on established lawns or 23 grass unless it is low phosphorous fertilizer.

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(2)] This subsection does not apply to:

(i) A landscaping contractor who is licensed under Title 8 of the
 Business Regulation Article; or

(ii) A salesperson, employee, or other agent of a landscaping
 contractor who is licensed under Title 8 of the Business Regulation Article.

29 (2) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, 30 ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 2011, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR DISTRIBUTE FOR USE 31 OR SALE AT A RETAIL ESTABLISHMENT IN THE STATE ANY FERTILIZER 32 INTENDED FOR USE ON ESTABLISHED LAWNS OR GRASS UNLESS IT IS LOW 33 PHOSPHOROUS FERTILIZER. **SENATE BILL 546** 

1 (b) (1) IN THIS SUBSECTION, "SPECIALTY FERTILIZER" INCLUDES 2 LOW PHOSPHOROUS FERTILIZER.

3 (2) ON OR AFTER APRIL 1, 2012, A PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR 4 DISTRIBUTE FOR USE OR SALE IN THE STATE ANY SPECIALTY FERTILIZER WITH 5 AVAILABLE PHOSPHOROUS CONTENT INTENDED FOR USE ON ESTABLISHED 6 LAWNS OR GRASS UNLESS IT IS INTENDED FOR USE AS A SEED STARTER ON 7 NEWLY ESTABLISHED LAWNS, GRASS, OR TURF, CONSISTENT WITH THE 8 RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND.

9 (C) (1) On or before April 1, 2011, a manufacturer of lawn fertilizer whose 10 products are sold in the State shall reduce by 50% from 2006 levels the amount of 11 available phosphoric acid ( $H_3PO_4$ ) resulting from the application of its lawn care 12 products within the State.

13 (2) The amount of available phosphoric acid (H<sub>3</sub>PO<sub>4</sub>) resulting from 14 the application within the State of lawn care products sold or distributed by a 15 manufacturer may not exceed an average of 1.5% available phosphoric acid (H<sub>3</sub>PO<sub>4</sub>) if, 16 prior to April 1, 2010, the manufacturer did not sell or distribute fertilizer in the State 17 intended for use on established lawns or grass.

18 (3) Beginning in 2011, a manufacturer of fertilizer whose products are 19 sold in the State shall report the pounds of phosphorus in its lawn care products sold 20 at retail locations in the State to the Department at the end of each calendar year.

21 [(c)] (D) The Department may adopt regulations to implement this section.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2011.
