18	(b) The Biennial Cancer Study shall:

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- 1 (2) The Department may contract with an entity to conduct one or 2 more biennial cancer studies or a part of one or more biennial cancer studies.
 - (e) On or before September 1 of each odd numbered fiscal year, beginning in fiscal year 2005, the Department shall submit a report to the Governor and, subject to § 2–1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly, on the results of the Biennial Cancer Study.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 2011.
