11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

#### Article – Family Law

(a) A person who fails to comply with the relief granted in an interim
protective order under § 4–504.1(c)(1), (2), (3), (4)(i), (7), or (8) of this subtitle, a
temporary protective order under § 4–505(a)(2)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (v), or (viii) of this
subtitle, or a final protective order under § 4–506(d)(1), (2), (3), (4), or (5), or (e) of this
subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject, for each offense, to:

20 (1) for a first offense, a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisonment not 21 exceeding 90 days or both; and

(2) for a second or subsequent offense, a fine not exceeding \$2,500 or
imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or both.

1 (b) An officer shall arrest with or without a warrant and take into custody a 2 person who the officer has probable cause to believe is in violation of an interim, 3 temporary, or final protective order in effect at the time of the violation.

### 4 (C) THE COURT SHALL ORDER A PERSON CHARGED WITH A VIOLATION 5 OF A PROTECTIVE ORDER UNDER THIS SECTION TO UNDERGO A MENTAL 6 HEALTH EVALUATION.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October 1, 2011.
