A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Video Lottery Terminals – Baltimore–Washington International Thurgood 3 Marshall Airport

4 FOR the purpose of altering the number of video lottery operation licenses and video $\mathbf{5}$ lottery terminals that may be awarded by the Video Lottery Facility Location 6 Commission to provide for the award of a video lottery operation license at $\mathbf{7}$ Baltimore-Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport under certain 8 conditions; providing that a certain restriction on the number of video lottery 9 operation licenses that may be awarded in a county or Baltimore City is not 10 applicable; requiring that certain proceeds be paid into the Transportation Trust Fund; providing that an application for a certain video lottery operation 11 12license be made by a certain date; making this Act contingent on the passage 13and ratification of a certain constitutional amendment; and generally relating to 14 the operation of video lottery terminals at a certain location in the State.

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 (a) On a properly approved transmittal prepared by the Commission, the 12 Comptroller shall pay the following amounts from the proceeds of video lottery 13 terminals at each video lottery facility:

7 (f) The Video Lottery Facility Location Commission may award not more 8 than [five] SIX video lottery operation licenses to qualified applicants, through a 9 competitive process consistent with the process for competitive sealed proposals under 10 Title 13 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

5 (j) (1) [An] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS 6 SUBSECTION, AN application submitted for a video lottery operation license under 7 this section shall include an initial license fee in the application of at least \$3,000,000 8 for each 500 video lottery terminals included in the application.

9 (2) AN APPLICATION SUBMITTED FOR A VIDEO LOTTERY 10 OPERATION LICENSE AT BALTIMORE–WASHINGTON INTERNATIONAL 11 THURGOOD MARSHALL AIRPORT SHALL BE SUBMITTED BY APRIL 15, 2013.

12 [(2)] (3) All initial license fees submitted under this subtitle shall 13 accrue to the Education Trust Fund established under § 9–1A–30 of this subtitle.

14 [(3)] (4) An application submitted for a video lottery operation 15 license under this section shall provide for at least \$25,000,000 in direct investment by 16 the applicant in construction and related costs for each 500 video lottery terminals 17 contained in the proposed application that shall be prorated based on the exact 18 number of video lottery terminals contained in the application.

19 (q) (1) Nothing in this subtitle may be construed to require the Video 20 Lottery Facility Location Commission to award all [five] SIX video lottery operation 21 licenses authorized under this subtitle.

(2) Notwithstanding any of the provisions of this subtitle, the Video
Lottery Facility Location Commission may not award a video lottery operation license
under this subtitle unless the Video Lottery Facility Location Commission determines
and declares that an applicant selected for award of the license is in the public interest
and is consistent with the purposes of this subtitle.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is contingent on 28 the passage of Chapter ____ (S.B. ___/H.B. ___)(1lr1432/1lr1616) of the Acts of the 29 General Assembly of 2011, a constitutional amendment, and its ratification by the 30 voters of the State.

31 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions 32 of Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall take effect on the proclamation of the Governor 33 that the constitutional amendment, having received a majority of the votes cast at the 34 general election, has been adopted by the people of Maryland.
