- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 18

21To provide a fund to pay the expense of protecting and managing wildlife, 22 and preventing unauthorized persons from hunting them, a person may not hunt or 23attempt to hunt during open season and in any permitted manner any game birds and 24 mammals in the State without first having procured either a resident or nonresident 25 hunter's license. A person may not hunt or attempt to hunt nongame birds and
