15 16	WHEREAS, Chess increases strategic thinking skills, stimulates intellectual creativity, and improves problem—solving ability while raising self—esteem; and
17 18	WHEREAS, When students play chess, they must call on higher-order thinking skills, analyze actions and consequences, and visualize future possibilities; and
19 20	WHEREAS, In countries where chess is offered widely in schools, students excel in math and science; and
21 22 23 24	WHEREAS, The Governor of the State of Maryland has declared the importance of promoting science, technology, engineering, and math education in the public schools to prepare students for the future and to allow Maryland to lead the nation in the number of science and technology jobs; now, therefore,

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 3 Article Education
- 4 **4–111.1.**
- 5 (A) THE DEPARTMENT MAY DEVELOP AND REVIEW CONTENT 6 STANDARDS FOR CHESS INSTRUCTION IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS.
- 7 (B) IF THE DEPARTMENT DEVELOPS, REVIEWS, AND APPROVES
 8 CONTENT STANDARDS UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, A COUNTY
 9 BOARD MAY IMPLEMENT THE CHESS INSTRUCTION IN ELEMENTARY, MIDDLE,
 10 OR HIGH SCHOOLS IN THE COUNTY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011.
