CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

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Calvert County – Alcoholic Beverages – Special Event License

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Special Event (SE) beer, wine and liquor license in 4 Calvert County; specifying that the license entitles the holder to sell beer, wine, $\mathbf{5}$ and liquor for consumption on the licensed premises; requiring that an 6 applicant for the license first obtain approval of the Board for certain items; 7specifying that an SE license may be valid for 1 or more days; authorizing the 8 Board to approve multiple venues where alcoholic beverages may be sold on the 9 licensed premises; authorizing the Board to require an applicant for the license 10 to provide certain security measures; providing certain license fees; requiring the Board to determine the number of licenses a single applicant may be issued 11 in a year; specifying that this Act does not prohibit the license holder from 12holding another alcoholic beverages license; authorizing the Board to adopt 13certain regulations; defining certain terms; making this Act an emergency 1415measure; and generally relating to alcoholic beverages in Calvert County.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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(E) THE BOARD MAY REQUIRE THAT AN APPLICANT FOR THE SE LICENSE PROVIDE SPECIFIC SECURITY MEASURES TO ENSURE THE PEACE AND SAFETY OF THE PUBLIC ON THE PREMISES FOR WHICH THE LICENSE IS SOUGHT. **(F)** THE SE LICENSE FEE IS: (1) **\$500,** IF THE EVENT IS PREDOMINANTLY FOR A COMMERCIAL PURPOSE; OR (2) \$25, IF THE EVENT IS PREDOMINANTLY FOR A CHARITABLE PURPOSE. THE BOARD SHALL DETERMINE THE NUMBER OF SE LICENSES A (G) SINGLE APPLICANT MAY BE ISSUED IN A YEAR. **(H)** THIS SECTION DOES NOT PROHIBIT THE LICENSE HOLDER FROM HOLDING ANOTHER ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES LICENSE OF A DIFFERENT CLASS **OR NATURE. (I)** THE BOARD MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2011 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
