CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

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Natural Resources Police Force - Number of Officers

3 FOR the purpose of stating the intent of the General Assembly that the Natural 4 Resources Police Force employ a certain number of Natural Resources police 5 officers by a certain date; requiring the Governor to include certain amounts in 6 the annual budget bills for certain fiscal years to make certain progress toward 7 achieving a certain employment goal; authorizing under certain circumstances, 8 beginning in a certain fiscal year and continuing each subsequent year, the 9 Natural Resources Police Force to increase the number of cadets and recruits enrolling in the Maryland Natural Resources Police Academy until the size of 10 the force is sufficient to meet a certain mission of the Department; requiring the 11 Natural Resources Police Force to provide certain reports to the General 12 Assembly on or before certain dates; and generally relating to the Natural 13 Resources Police Force. 14

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WHEREAS, Chapter 367 of the Acts of 2010 demonstrated the intent of the General Assembly to strengthen enforcement of the State's conservation laws consistent with the public trust doctrine, which affirms government's responsibility to administer, protect, manage, and conserve fish and wildlife for the benefit of the public; and

WHEREAS, The lingering economic recession has resulted in a historic reduction in financial support from the General Fund to the Natural Resources Police Force, resulting in fewer Natural Resources police officers in the field and on the waterways and more frequent violation of the State's conservation laws; and

WHEREAS, Since 1990, there has been a 50% decrease in the number of Natural Resources police officers in the State; and

WHEREAS, The intent of this Act is to increase the number of Natural Resource police officers employed by the Natural Resources Police Force to at least 435 officers within the next 10 years, with due regard to the dictates of fiscal practicality, to safeguard the State's legacy of protecting natural resources for the benefit of future generations; now, therefore,

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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- 21 (A) IT IS THE INTENT OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY THAT THE NATURAL RESOURCES POLICE FORCE EMPLOY AT LEAST 435 NATURAL RESOURCES POLICE OFFICERS BY FISCAL YEAR 2021.
- 24(B) THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN EACH ANNUAL BUDGET BILL 25 BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2013 AND ENDING IN FISCAL YEAR 2021 AMOUNTS SUFFICIENT TO MAKE INCREMENTAL PROGRESS TOWARD ACHIEVING THE 26 EMPLOYMENT GOAL FOR THE NATURAL RESOURCES POLICE FORCE STATED IN 27 28SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION (1) TO THE EXTENT THAT FUNDS ARE 29 AVAILABLE AS BUDGET CONDITIONS IMPROVE IN THE STATE, BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 2013 AND CONTINUING IN EACH SUBSEQUENT YEAR, THE 30 NATURAL RESOURCES POLICE FORCE MAY INCREASE THE NUMBER OF CADETS 31 AND RECRUITS ENROLLING IN THE MARYLAND NATURAL RESOURCES POLICE 32 33 ACADEMY UNTIL THE SIZE OF THE FORCE IS SUFFICIENT TO MEET THE MISSION 34 OF THE DEPARTMENT.

- 2 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE PROGRESS THE POLICE FORCE
- 3 HAS MADE IN ACHIEVING THE GOAL OF EMPLOYING NATURAL RESOURCES
- 4 POLICE OFFICERS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 July 1, 2011.
