11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

We are requesting a Bond Bill for \$500,00 for the improvement of our current facility. We have raised \$225,456.90 of the \$250,000 in required matching funds. In 1993 we used "sweat equity" by staff and verterans to build and improve the facility. We believe that our veterans deserve a clean and safe environment in which to recover from the ravages of drug and alcohol addition. The electrical system and elevator are decades old and have been patched together when they have failed. We want to install a generator for use with our freezers when the power is interrupted. Lack of back up electricity causes food spoilage. In addition we are in need of elevator replacement, heating, ventilation and air conditioning replacement and asbestos removal from the basement. Updates will better prepare MCVET for Operation Enduring Freedom and OIF veterans who will be in need of our services in the near future.
