## Garrett County - Vacancy in Office of County Commissioner - Appointment Process

This bill alters the procedures for filling a vacancy in an office of county commissioner in Garrett County by requiring the Governor to use procedures required for other commission counties, subject to the requirement that in Garrett County the nominee or appointee reside in the same commissioner district in which the former county commissioner resided.

## **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None.

**Local Effect:** None. The bill will not materially alter Garrett County operations or finances as the Governor will continue to make appointments to fill commissioner vacancies.

**Small Business Effect:** None.

### **Analysis**

**Current Law:** When a vacancy occurs in the office of county commissioner, the Governor must appoint a new commissioner applicable to commission counties and code home rule counties; unless, a code home rule county has enacted a public local law providing other procedures for appointing a new commissioner. Procedures for appointing a new county commissioner, should the position become vacant, are provided in Article 25, Section 16.

**Background:** There are three forms of county government in Maryland: commission, charter home rule, and code home rule. **Exhibit 1** shows the form of government for each Maryland county and the year in which local home rule was granted.
