11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Falling Green land was originally purchased by James Brooke, a founding leader of the Sandy Spring Quaker meeting, and one of the largest land-holders in Montgomery County in the late 1700s. Built circa 1770, Falling Green remains intact and survives as an excellent example of late Georgian/early Federal style. Plans include the complete restoration of the original structure, removal of two dilapidated additions, and the construction of a new addition to house modern systems. Infrastructure improvements including upgrading the well system, is needed to accommodate the needs of field maintenance and house. Currently, water is provided by WSSC at a substantial annual cost to OBGC (average \$50,000/year). OBGC will be more self-sufficient and operating costs will improve significantly when the infrastructure improvements are made.
