Department of Health and Mental Hygiene - Recovery Homes - Best Practices

This bill requires the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene (DHMH) to identify standards for best practices for recovery homes. DHMH must report its findings to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 31, 2011.

The bill takes effect July 1, 2011.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: The bill's requirements can be handled with existing resources. Revenues are not affected.

Local Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law/Background: Recovery homes provide temporary residential services for individuals recovering from alcohol or drug addiction. DHMH does not currently regulate recovery homes. The number of recovery homes in the State is unknown, but DHMH estimates that there are approximately 300.
