10 Description and Purpose of Crantae Organization (Limit Length to Visible gran)								

Founded in 2007, the African Leadership Empowerment Council (ALEC) is the largest, constituted active African organization in the state of Maryland with constant civic engagement and community service at the local, state and federal levels. The organization reaches out to over thirty African churches and community organizations in the region with a mission to engage the African immigrant community in community service, civic engagement, improve the quality of life for low income families, serve as a point of contact for African immigrants in the region, provide equal treatment and full access to social programs, referrals to government resources and opportunities. ALEC operates the following programs: (1) The African House assistance to the needy and homeless people; (2) ALEC Leadership Academy with successful summer internships; (3) ALEC Education and Mentorship program providing free tutoring and mentorship to High School students; (4) ALEC Health & HIV/AIDS Awareness Program; (5) ALEC Business & Entrepreneurial Development; and (6) ALEC-AmeriCorps Program for Citizenship and Naturalization classes and awareness in the African communities.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

ALEC is acquiring this surplus property from the Prince George's County government at "No Condition for Community Use." However, the symbolic amount to be paid by ALEC is not yet determined since the property is undergoing the legislative draft in the Office of Central Services. The ALEC-African House will house other African non-profit partner organizations to provide:

- (1) A One Stop Resource and Assistance Center for African immigrants.
- (2) ALEC Leadership Academy training for young people in leadership and summer internships.
- (3) ALEC Education and Mentorship program providing free tutoring and mentorship to High School students.
- (4) ALEC Health & HIV/AIDS Awareness Program with seminars and workshops.
- (5) ALEC Business & Entrepreneurial Development for young people and minority businesses.
- (6) ALEC-AmeriCorps Program for Citizenship and Naturalization classes and awareness in the African communities.
- (7) Job training, job search, resume writing, and workforce development.
- (8) A Kitchen to provide meals to homeless people in the area.

ALEC is projecting to use space with about 10 other non-profit organizations that are affiliated to ALEC at no charge as a point of contacts, civic engagement, immigration and citizenship awareness, health and HIV/AIDS awareness, education and mentorship assistance to High School students, job training and job referrals, referrals to government services and programs, energy and rent assistance, food stamps, assistance to the needy and the homeless, general programs and community service throughout the County.
- 2. We are requesting this property in order to reinforce our activities in Prince George's County, especially in the Legislative District 21.
- 3. ALEC has been recognized with a Senatorial Letter for "...its commitment to bringing together African immigrants and African-Americans to transcend ethnicity and national identity" (Senator Benjamin Cardin, May 30, 2009).
- 4. ALEC has also been recognized with a Senatorial Citation for "...promoting leadership and community involvement at the local, state and national levels with a focus on creating sustainable and institutional partnerships between the government and the Continental African Community" (Senator Benjamin Cardin, March 20, 2010).
- 5. In addition, ALEC has been recognized with a Congressional Letter as follows: "ALEC has made many important contributions to the promotion of domestic and International public policy issues as they relate to the African community" (Congresswoman Donna Edwards, May 30, 2009).
- 6. Finally, ALEC has also been recognized by the Prince George's County Council with a County Council Proclamation stating that "Whereas, the Prince George's County Council is honored to have this opportunity to recognize the exemplary contributions of the African Leadership Empowerment Council (ALEC) in Prince George's County and throughout the nation;....Now, Therefore, Be It Proclaimed by the Prince George's County Council that the African Leadership Empowerment Council (ALEC) is saluted for its exceptional commitment in partnership with the Prince George's County" (Prince George's County Council, September 28, 2010).
