11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Currently, a multi-purpose building houses a very small animal clinic space, the animal commissary and a limited quarantine facility. It is mandated through our accreditation with the Association of Zoos and Aquariums (AZA) that these functions be separated. The Zoo has been accredited since the mid-70's. In order to maintain our accreditation, we must build an adequate quarantine facility to accommodate our collection and a medical facility to treat injuries and illnesses within the collection. The designed building will provide proper medical space for this size zoo and animal collection, as well as, provide the opportunity to separate the medical activities from the diet preparation activities. Thus, eliminating the possibilities of cross-contamination between the clinic and quarantine cases with the remaining display collection. The current lack of space has required us to perform surgeries outdoors on larger animals. All animals coming into the Zoo's collection are required to go through a minimum of 30 days of quarantine before being introduced to the display collection. During this time, medical tests are performed to ensure that the animal is not harboring any communicable diseases that may affect the rest of the collection. The new Clinic will provide much greater efficiency in addressing all the medical needs of the animals.

The construction of this building is very important to the future of the Salisbury Zoological Park. As we move towards the implementation of our Master Plan, AZA accreditation is critical to our future success. The completion of the Animal Health Clinic will help ensure that the Zoo maintains its high level of animal management procedures and meets the AZA accreditation standards. The ability to provide consistent, modern medical care for our collection is very important; as is, the ability to quickly and efficiently address those medical needs. As mandated by the AZA accreditation standards, we must quarantine all animals entering the collection for a minimum of 30 days (primates are quarantined for 60 days). The Animal Health Clinic will provide us that ability and help us meet the stringent requirements of AZA accreditation. This accreditation is important since it is required to be able to house and display many of the endangered species currently in our collection, as well as, many of those listed in the Master Plan of the Zoo. Because of this, the construction of the Animal Health Clinic truly represents the cornerstone of the Zoo and its future development.
