<b>10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization</b> (Limit Length to Visible area) Built in 1793, the Star-Spangled Banner Flag House was the home and place of business of Mary							

Built in 1793, the Star-Spangled Banner Flag House was the home and place of business of Mary Pickersgill, maker of the flag that inspired Francis Scott Key's famous poem that later became our national anthem. In 1927, the house was sold to the City of Baltimore and the Star-Spangled Banner Flag House Association established a museum inside the historic home. It was established as a National Historic Landmark in 1970.

The Battle of Baltimore was a decisive victory that renewed the hopes of a demoralized young nation. The Flag House is part of Maryland's unique contribution to the defense and heritage of the United States. The Flag House is located on the new, federally designated Star-Spangled Banner Trail (similar to the Freedom Trail in Boston) and will play a major role in the War of 1812 Bicentennial Celebration.

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The Star-Spangled Banner Flag House is a bustling campus comprised of three buildings: the historic Flag House, the Original Museum Building (built in the 1950's) and the Hofmeister Museum Building adjacent to a courtyard, which is one of the few green spaces in downtown Baltimore. Funds are requested to renovate the Original Museum Building, vacated in 2003 with the opening of the Hofmeister Museum Building, and surrounding grounds. Specifically, funds will help the Flag House transform the interior spaces into classrooms and hands-on learning spaces, making the institution a more inviting destination for families and offer student groups--the museum's largest audience segment--increased options for learning and discovering history. Exterior renovations will make the site more accessible and inviting to visitors of all ages.
