10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)				
<p>The Kennard Alumni Association, Inc. (KAA) was formed by a group of graduates and attendees of Kennard High School to commemorate and celebrate our mutual history and heritage. In 1966 the school was leased (99 yrs.) to KAA by the Queen Anne's County Commissioners. Since that time, the organization's purpose and goal has been to restore this historic building, which was the first secondary school for African Americans in Queen Anne's County, to working condition and convert it to be used as a museum and cultural heritage center for youth and adults of Queen Anne's County and beyond, focusing on the under served population of our community. As a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit, we also provide annual scholarship assistance to qualified descendants of past Kennard High School attendees. Upon completion, the alumni association will shift its focus to funding the operational expenses of the cultural, educational, recreational, and resource referral programs of the "Kennard High School African American Cultural Heritage Center", while continuing to provide scholarship assistance.</p>				

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Kennard High School (KHS), Queen Anne's County's first and only secondary school for African Americans, was built in 1936. KHS is a contributing structure in the Centreville (MD) Historic District, which is listed in the Nat'l Register of Historic Places. This 9400 sq. ft. building with six classrooms, principal's office, small library, and 2 bathrooms was magnificent for its time, but has deteriorated through non-use over the past 37 years. Structural decay represented its biggest threat. Phase I of this project (new roof, asbestos removal, project estimate, and building use plans) was completed in 2007. The building is currently closed to the public at least until the completion of Phase II (architectural plans, exterior shingles & doors, restored windows, and floors), for which funding has been secured and work is scheduled to be completed by late Spring, 2011. Phase III, for which we are seeking funding, will upgrade HVAC, plumbing, electrical, and interior structural support. Upon completion, the building will be renamed "Kennard High School African American Cultural Heritage Center". It will be used for historical tours and a variety of ongoing educational, cultural, and recreational programs for youth and adults. It is estimated that this facility will serve at least 2,500 people annually, once renovations are complete.
