10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)								
Howard County, Maryland is the Grantee organization. The Department of Recreation and Parks manages over 8,000 acres of land and 49 developed recreation areas in Howard County. The								

manages over 8,000 acres of land and 49 developed recreation areas in Howard County. The Department, in consort with the Howard County Department of Public Works will secure an architectural and engineering firm to design the park based on the Blandair Master Plan. Park construction will begin in fiscal year 2011 upon completion of the design effort. The quality of the county's facilities and programs is a testament to the County's ability to manage and operate this regional park.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

The design and construction of this 300-acre park will be in accordance with the revised/approved Blandair Regional Park Master Plan. The Master Plan includes an environmental education center, pathways and walking trails, court games, athletic fields, picnic facilities, an indoor sports hall, a children's garden, playgrounds, a maintenance facility, roads, parking and renovation of the Blandair Mansion and outbuildings, that are protected under a 28-acre easement granted to the Maryland Historical Trust.

A Regional Park of this magnitude will draw visitors from throughout the County as well as adjacent jurisdictions. The County population to be served is currently in excess of 280,000 people. This facility can host large festivals and athletic tournaments and will greatly benefit the local economy, particularly restaurants, hotels, sporting goods stores and small markets. This park is in the Planned Service Area (Smart Growth Area) of Howard County and will help reduce the current over-usage of Centennial Park. This project is identified in the 2005 Land Preservation,
