10. Description and Purpose of Grantee Organization (Limit Length to Visible area)				
<p>Greater Baden Medical Services, Inc. is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) that was founded in 1972. Accredited by the Joint Commission, the system takes pride in serving communities in southern Prince George's County, Charles County, and St. Mary's County, Maryland.</p> <p>Comprised of six health centers that provide a spectrum of services, Greater Baden is a community based health provider that is committed to delivering the highest quality of healthcare services.</p> <p>Through four decades, Greater Baden Medical Services (GBMS) vision is to eliminate health disparities and improve the health of the community through the provision of quality, affordable health care services.</p>				

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Greater Baden Medical Services intends to enter into a 15 year lease with the Civista Health Foundation to relocate an existing Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) from Nanjemoy to LaPlata. The relocated FQHC will housed on the first floor of the original Physicians Memorial Hospital that was opened in 1939. The Charles County government officially transferred the original Physicians Memorial Hospital building and property to the Civista Health Foundation in December 2010. This existing space in this building to be leased by Greater Baden requires substantial renovation and modernization to serve as a primary care clinic and to meet building codes and ADA requirements.

28. Comments: (Limit Length to Visible area)

The purpose of this bond bill will be the creation of a State Debt in the amount of \$400,000, the proceeds to be used as a grant to the Board of Directors of Greater Baden Medical Services, Inc. (GBMS) for certain improvement purposes associated with the renovation on the first floor of the original Physicians Memorial Hospital (PMH) property, including bringing the building's entry into ADA compliance; providing for the disbursement of loan proceeds; establishing a deadline for the expenditure of the loan proceeds; and providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan.

As part of its wider network of primary care facilities, GBMS currently operates a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) in Nanjemoy, MD. This existing FQHC in Nanjemoy has insufficient patient volumes to support a financially viable operation and is not centrally located to the other underserved patient populations throughout Charles County.

The Charles County government transferred the original PMH building (circa 1939) and property to the Civista Health Foundation (CHF) in December 2010. Months prior to the official transfer, planning had begun to determine the best use for the space and how to integrate it into the hospital campus. As part of this process, GBMS and CHF began negotiations to lease the first floor of the original PMH building to GBMS to establish a more centrally located FQHC serving the entire County. The immediate adjacency of the relocated FQHC to Civista Medical Center will be a major benefit to patient care provided by both organizations. GBMS will have ready access to inpatient, outpatient and emergency services. In turn, Civista will have an FQHC to refer patients requiring follow-up care. This is particularly important in a County with a severe shortage of physicians.

At Present the entrance to the building does not comply with ADA Standards for accessibility. The \$400,000.00 state grant will be used by GBMS to bring the building's entry into ADA compliance, and to renovate the first floor of the original PMH building to create a modern primary care clinic that includes: eight (8) patient exam rooms, a nurses' station, laboratory, consultation room, offices, reception and waiting and necessary support spaces. The interior of the building features an elevator that is original to the 1930's building and is believed to be the State's oldest operating elevator. It is not ideal for those who may need to utilize this method of transportation and a new elevator is required to meet ADA standards. On the exterior, it will be necessary to expand the existing parking lot by approximately 20-25 spaces to assure the availability of parking to GBMS's patients and staff.
