11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit Length to Visible area)

Renovation of men's and women's restrooms including bringing them into compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The poor condition of the rooms requires complete removal of present interiors, excavation and reconfiguration of all water and waste lines to make handicapped stalls accessible to wheel chairs, supplying new, appropriate ADA compliant stalls, toilets, sinks, grab bars, mirrors, and soap and towel dispensers. New entrance doors, lighting fixtures, sprinkler systems and both nonskid floor and wall tiles are required. The men's room door must be widened to accommodate wheel chairs and part of a wall has to be removed to improve access between the men's room and the lobby. A high-low drinking fountain will replace the water cooler now in use in the lobby. This last will save at least \$550 annually, the cost of bottled water in last year's fiscal budget.

The current condition of the restrooms is so deteriorated as to be out of compliance with the
sanitation standards of the county.
Having received no update since GAC leased the space in 1993, and no known improvements since
1937, these facilities are in danger of failing completely.
In addition, the restrooms do not comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act, thus preventing
disabled individuals from attending performances or participating in their production. If fundraising
is unsuccessful, at some point, the Greenbelt Arts Center would be forced to close, denying
residents of the area an important cultural resource and diminishing the vitality of the Roosevelt
Center with its restaurants, the Coop, and other small businesses.
