## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Private Property Rights – Regulatory Infringement – Compensation

3 FOR the purpose of giving an owner of private property a cause of action under certain 4 circumstances against the Department of the Environment, the Department of  $\mathbf{5}$ Natural Resources, or the Department of Planning if the application of a 6 regulation adopted by the agency infringes on a private property right; 7 providing that the cause of action shall be filed in a certain court; providing for 8 the sum that a private property owner may recover under a certain cause of 9 action; requiring the award or judgment under a certain cause of action to be paid from certain funds and prohibiting payment from the General Fund; 10 providing for the venue of a certain cause of action; establishing a certain 11 12statute of limitations; providing for the application of this Act; defining a certain 13 term; and generally relating to the rights of private property owners.

1 IN THIS SUBTITLE, "PRIVATE PROPERTY" MEANS ANY REAL PROPERTY IN 2 THE STATE OTHER THAN REAL PROPERTY OWNED BY A UNIT OF FEDERAL, 3 STATE, OR LOCAL GOVERNMENT.

5 THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE 6 DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT, THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL 7 RESOURCES, OR THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING THAT ARE:

(1) **REQUIRED TO COMPLY WITH FEDERAL LAW; OR** 

- 9 (2) NECESSARY TO PROTECT PUBLIC SAFETY.

11 (A) THE OWNER OF PRIVATE PROPERTY HAS A CAUSE OF ACTION 12 AGAINST THE STATE IF THE APPLICATION OF A REGULATION ADOPTED ON OR 13 AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2012, BY THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT, THE 14 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, OR THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING 15 RESTRICTS, LIMITS, OR OTHERWISE INFRINGES ON A RIGHT TO THE PRIVATE 16 PROPERTY THAT WOULD EXIST ABSENT THE APPLICATION.

17 (B) AN ACTION UNDER THIS SUBTITLE SHALL BE FILED IN A CIRCUIT 18 COURT AS PROVIDED IN § 6–203 OF THE COURTS ARTICLE.

20 (A) IN AN ACTION FILED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, THE PROPERTY OWNER 21 MAY RECOVER:

(1) A SUM EQUAL TO THE DIMINUTION IN THE FAIR MARKET
VALUE OF THE PORTION OF THE PRIVATE PROPERTY AFFECTED BY THE
APPLICATION OF THE REGULATION THAT IS THE BASIS OF THE ACTION; AND

25 (2) COURT COSTS, REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES, AND 26 REASONABLE EXPENSES.

(B) (1) AN AWARD OR JUDGMENT IN FAVOR OF A PROPERTY OWNER
MADE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE SHALL BE PAID OUT OF THE BUDGET OF THE
AGENCY RESPONSIBLE FOR ADOPTING THE REGULATION THAT IS THE BASIS OF
THE ACTION.

1 (2) AN AWARD OR JUDGMENT IN FAVOR OF A PROPERTY OWNER 2 MADE UNDER THIS SUBTITLE MAY NOT BE PAID FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF 3 THE STATE.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2012.
