A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Transportation – Toll, Fee, or Other Charge Increases – Notice and Public Comment

4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain staff of the Maryland Transportation Authority $\mathbf{5}$ to provide, by a certain date, public notice regarding a proposal to increase 6 certain tolls, fees, or other charges; requiring the Authority to make the 7 proposal available to the public in a certain manner; requiring the Authority to 8 receive comments from the public at the meeting at which the Authority votes 9 to implement the proposal; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to notice and public comments regarding a proposal to 10 increase certain tolls, fees, or other charges by the Maryland Transportation 11 12Authority.

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 16 17 18 19	(a) (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of § 20 of Section 3 and § 16 of Section 4 of Chapter 608 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1976, tolls may continue to be charged on the John F. Kennedy Memorial Highway and any project constructed under the provisions of § 3 (bridge, tunnel, and motorway revenue bonds) of Chapter 608 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1976.

27 28 29 30 31 32	(3) (1) AT LEAST 30 DAYS BEFORE A VOTE BY THE AUTHORITY TO IMPLEMENT A PROPOSAL TO INCREASE TOLLS, FEES, OR OTHER CHARGES ON ANY PART OF A TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES PROJECT, THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY OF THE AUTHORITY OR OTHER APPROPRIATE STAFF DESIGNATED BY THE CHAIR OF THE AUTHORITY SHALL PROVIDE NOTICE OF THE PROPOSAL TO THE PUBLIC.	
33 34	(II) THE AUTHORITY SHALL MAKE THE PROPOSAL AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC ON THE OFFICIAL WEB SITE OF THE AUTHORITY.	

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1 (III) THE AUTHORITY SHALL RECEIVE COMMENTS FROM THE 2 PUBLIC ON THE PROPOSAL AT THE MEETING AT WHICH THE AUTHORITY VOTES 3 TO IMPLEMENT THE PROPOSAL.

4 (b) The rentals, rates, fees, tolls, and other charges and revenues designated $\mathbf{5}$ as security for any bonds issued under this subtitle shall be fixed and adjusted from 6 time to time, either with respect to a particular transportation facilities project or in 7respect of the aggregate of the charges and revenues from other transportation 8 facilities projects under the control of the Authority, as may be specified by law or in 9 any applicable resolution or trust agreement, so as to provide funds that, together 10 with any other available revenues, are sufficient as long as the bonds are outstanding 11 and unpaid to:

12 (1) Pay the costs of maintaining, repairing, and operating the 13 transportation facilities project or projects financed in whole or in part by one or more 14 series of outstanding and unpaid bonds, to the extent that payment is not otherwise 15 provided;

16 (2) Pay the principal of and the interest on these bonds as they become17 due and payable;

18 (3) Create reasonable reserves that are anticipated will be needed for19 these purposes; and

20 (4) Provide funds for paying the cost of replacements, renewals, and 21 improvements.

(c) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the rentals, rates,
fees, tolls, and other charges and revenues are not subject to supervision or regulation
by any instrumentality, agency, or unit of this State or any of its political subdivisions.

(2) This subtitle does not permit the exercise of any power or the
 undertaking of any activity that would conflict with the provisions and limitations of
 the federal Urban Mass Transportation Act of 1964.

(3) Tolls for the use of the bridge carrying the John F. Kennedy
Memorial Highway over the Susquehanna River may not be less than the comparable
tolls charged for the use of the Susquehanna River Bridge.

(4) Prior to fixing or revising tolls on any part of any transportation
facilities project, the Authority shall provide, in accordance with § 2–1246 of the State
Government Article, to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, Senate Finance
Committee, House Appropriations Committee, and House Ways and Means
Committee information on the proposed toll charges, including:

36 (i) The annual revenues generated by the toll charges;

1	(ii)	The proposed use of the revenues; and
2	(iii)	The proposed commuter discount rates.
3	SECTION 2. AND	BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency
4	measure, is necessary for	or the immediate preservation of the public health or safety,
5	has been passed by a ye	ea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members
6	elected to each of the tw	o Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from

7 the date it is enacted.

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
