FISCAL AND POLICY NOTE

House Bill 2 (Montgomery County Delegation)

Rules and Executive Nominations

Montgomery County - Board of Education Residence Districts - Redistricting Plan MC 1-11SS

This emergency bill redistricts the five Montgomery County Board of Education districts from which five school board members are elected. The bill also repeals a requirement regarding the date when reapportioned districts become effective.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: The Montgomery County Board of Elections can make adjustments to board of education districts with existing resources.

Small Business Effect: None.

Analysis

Current Law: Redistricting of board of education districts occurs every 10 years, following the decennial Census. The Montgomery County Board of Education consists of five members elected from five board of education districts, two members elected from the county at large, and one student member.

Background: The Montgomery County Board of Education is 1 of 18 elected school boards in Maryland, and 1 of 4 school boards for which some or all board members are elected from local school board districts. There are five appointed school boards in the State, including one (Caroline County) that is in the process of transitioning to a hybrid board of appointed and elected members. Harford County has such a hybrid board. The

selection method and number of school board members for each of the 24 local boards are shown in **Exhibit 1**.
