- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article – Election Law

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1 (a) (1) Upon the filing of a petition, and unless it has been declared 2 deficient under § 6–206 of this subtitle, the staff of the election authority shall proceed 3 to verify the signatures and count the validated signatures contained in the petition.

4 (2) The purpose of signature verification under paragraph (1) of this 5 subsection is to ensure that the name of the individual who signed the petition is listed 6 as a registered voter.

7 (b) (1) The State Board, by regulation, shall establish the process to be 8 followed by all election authorities for verifying and counting signatures on petitions.

9 (2) SUBJECT TO REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE STATE BOARD 10 TO ENSURE THE INTEGRITY, ACCURACY, AND EFFICIENCY OF THE PROCESS OF 11 VERIFYING AND COUNTING SIGNATURES ON PETITIONS, THE PROCESS SHALL BE 12 OPEN TO OBSERVATION BY REPRESENTATIVES OF THE PETITION SPONSOR, 13 OPPONENTS OF THE PETITION, AND OTHER MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectJune 1, 2012.
