ASSISTANT, OR LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER who treats a minor is not liable for civil damages or subject to any criminal or disciplinary penalty solely because the minor did not have capacity to consent under this section.

- (f) Without the consent of or over the express objection of a minor, the attending physician, psychologist, REGISTERED NURSE, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, OR LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER, or, on advice or direction of the attending physician [or], psychologist, REGISTERED NURSE, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, OR LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER, a member of the medical staff of a hospital or public clinic may, but need not, give a parent, guardian, or custodian of the minor or the spouse of the parent information about treatment needed by the minor or provided to the minor under this section, except information about an abortion.
