21	WHEREAS, Beginning January 1, 2014, the federal Patient Protection and
22	Affordable Care Act will provide Medicaid coverage to independent foster care
23	adolescents who are under the age of 26 years; and



1 2 3	WHEREAS, Chapter 681 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2009 expanded Medicaid coverage to independent foster care adolescents who are under the age of 21 years; and
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS, The General Assembly has an opportunity to provide Medicaid coverage to independent foster care adolescents who are under the age of 26 years before the expansion of coverage is implemented by the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act; now, therefore,
8 9	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12	(a) In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.
13	(d-1) "Independent foster care adolescent" means an individual:
14	(1) Who is under <b>[</b> 21 <b>] 26</b> years of age; and
15 16	(2) Who, on the individual's 18th birthday, was in foster care under the responsibility of the State.

18 19	(a) (1) The Secretary shall administer the Maryland Medical Assistance Program.

21 22 23	(xi) Shall provide, subject to the limitations of the State budget, and as permitted by federal law, comprehensive medical care and other health care services for independent foster care adolescents:
24 25	1. Who are not otherwise eligible for Program benefits; and
26 27	2. Whose annual household income is at or below 300 percent of the poverty level;
28 29 30 31	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012. If the U.S. Supreme Court rules that the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, or any provision of the Act that expands Medicaid coverage to independent foster care adolescents, is unconstitutional, with no further action
