2 Maryland Condominium Act – Right of Entry to Investigate Damage and 3 Make Repairs

FOR the purpose of authorizing the council of unit owners of a condominium or its 4 5 authorized designee to enter units to investigate damage; repealing a certain 6 restriction on the right of a council of unit owners or its designee to enter a unit; 7 requiring a council of unit owners to make a reasonable effort to give notice to 8 the owner of a unit to be entered for the purpose of investigation except under 9 certain circumstances; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the right of a council of unit owners to enter a unit to investigate damage and make 10 11 repairs.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article Real Property
- 20 11–125.
- 21 (e) **(1)** The council of unit owners or its authorized designee shall have an irrevocable right and an easement to enter units to **INVESTIGATE DAMAGE OR** make repairs [when the repairs reasonably appear necessary for public safety or to prevent damage to other portions of the condominium].

- **(2)** Except in cases involving manifest danger to public safety or property, the council of unit owners shall make a reasonable effort to give notice to the owner of any unit to be entered for the purpose of **INVESTIGATION OR** repair.
- **(3)** If damage is inflicted on the common elements or any unit through which access is taken, the council of unit owners is liable for the prompt repair.
- **(4)** An entry by the council of unit owners for the purposes specified in this subsection may not be considered a trespass.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2012.
