## A BILL ENTITLED

2 Carroll County - Polling Places - Electioneering Boundaries

FOR the purpose of making Carroll County subject to the general rule for locating the line beyond which electioneering is prohibited outside a polling place;

requiring that the line be as near as practicable to a certain distance from the entrance and exit of the polling place; repealing an exception, applicable to

Carroll County, regarding the boundaries for electioneering outside a polling

place; and generally relating to electioneering at a polling place in Carroll

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 17 Article Election Law
- 18 16–206.
- 19 (a) A person may not:
- 20 (1) place any distinguishing mark on the person's own or another 21 person's ballot for the purpose of identifying the ballot;
- 22 (2) misrepresent the person's ability to mark a ballot or operate voting
- 23 equipment;

- 1 interfere or attempt to interfere with a voter while the voter is (3)2 inside the polling room, marking a ballot, or operating voting equipment; 3 induce or attempt to induce a voter to mark the voter's ballot in a (4) 4 certain way; 5 except for servicing by an authorized person, unlock any locked 6 compartment of a voting device unless instructed to do so by the election director; 7 destroy or deface a ballot; (6)remove a ballot from a building in which voting occurs, except as 8 (7)9 otherwise provided in this article; 10 delay the delivery of a ballot; (8)possess on or before the day of election an official ballot printed for 11 (9)12 the election, unless the possession of the ballot is necessary and appropriate for 13 carrying out the election process; or 14 canvass, electioneer, or post any campaign material in the polling 15 place or beyond a line established by signs posted in accordance with subsection (b) of this section. 16 17 (b) At each polling place, one election judge from each principal political party shall be designated by the local board and, acting jointly, shall post 18 19 signs delineating a line around the entrance and exit of the building that are closest to 20 that part of the building in which voting occurs. 21(2)(i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, 22
  - (2) (i) Except as provided in subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, the line shall be located as near as practicable to 100 feet from the entrance and exit and shall be established after consideration of the configuration of the entrance and the effect of placement on public safety and the flow of pedestrian and vehicular traffic.
- 26 (ii) In [Carroll County and] Montgomery County, on approval of 27 the local board, the line may be located at any point between 25 feet and 100 feet from 28 the entrance and exit.
- 29 (3) The signs shall contain the words "No Electioneering Beyond this 30 Point".
- 31 (c) A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and is 32 subject to a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$500 or imprisonment for not more 33 than 60 days or both.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
