## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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## **Real Property – Condominiums – Rescission of Sales Contracts**

3 FOR the purpose of limiting a condominium purchaser's right to rescind in writing a 4 contract of sale based on amended material in a vendor's public offering  $\mathbf{5}$ statement to certain amendments that affect materially and adversely the 6 purchaser's rights; requiring a purchaser to state in writing the purchaser's 7 reason for rescission when it is based on certain amended material in a vendor's 8 public offering statement; stating the intent of the General Assembly; making 9 stylistic changes; and generally relating to the rescission of condominium sales 10 contracts.

- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 (a) A contract for the initial sale of a unit to a member of the public is not  $\mathbf{2}$ enforceable by the vendor unless: 3 The purchaser is given on or before the time a contract is entered (1)4 into between the vendor and the purchaser, a current public offering statement as  $\mathbf{5}$ amended and registered with the Secretary of State containing all of the information set forth in subsection (b) of this section; and 6 7(2)The contract of sale contains, in conspicuous type, a notice of: 8 (i) The purchaser's right to receive a public offering statement 9 and his rescission rights under this section; and 10 The warranties provided by § 11-131 of this title. (ii) 11 (b)The public offering statement required by subsection (a) of this section 12shall be sufficient for the purposes of this section if it contains at least the following: 13A copy of the proposed contract of sale for the unit: (1)A copy of the proposed declaration, bylaws, and rules and 14(2)regulations; 1516 A copy of the proposed articles of incorporation of the council of (3)17unit owners, if it is to be incorporated; 18 (4)A copy of any proposed management contract, insurance contract, employment contract, or other contract affecting the use of, maintenance of, or access 19 20to all or part of the condominium to which it is anticipated the unit owners or the 21council of unit owners will be a party, and a statement of the right of the council of 22unit owners to terminate contracts entered into during the developer control period 23under § 11–133 of this title; 24A copy of the actual annual operating budget for the condominium (5)25or, if no actual operating budget exists, a copy of the projected annual operating 26budget for the condominium including reasonable details concerning: 27The estimated monthly payments by the purchaser for (i) 28assessments; 29(ii) Monthly charges for the use, rental, or lease of any facilities 30 not part of the condominium; 31(iii) The amount of the reserve fund for repair and replacement 32and its intended use; and

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1 Any initial capital contribution or similar fee, other than (iv)  $\mathbf{2}$ assessments for common expenses, to be paid by unit owners to the council of unit 3 owners or vendor, and a statement of how the fees will be used: 4 (6)A plain language statement of the policy and procedures for  $\mathbf{5}$ collecting assessments and handling collection of delinguencies, including reasonable details concerning: 6 7The number and percentage of unit owners who are (i) 8 delinquent or in arrears in an amount equal to or greater than 50% of the annual 9 assessment of the unit owner: 10 The number of unsatisfied liens currently recorded against (ii) unit owners under the Maryland Contract Lien Act: 11 12(iiii) The number of unsatisfied judgments obtained against unit 13owners for unpaid assessments; and 14The total amount of arrearages among all unit owners; (iv) 15A copy of any lease to which it is anticipated the unit owners or the (7)16council of unit owners will be a party following closing; 17A description of any contemplated expansion of the condominium (8)with a general description of each stage of expansion and the maximum number of 18 units that can be added to the condominium; 1920A copy of the floor plan of the unit or the proposed condominium (9)21plats; 22(10)A description of any recreational or other facilities which are to be 23used by the unit owners or maintained by them or by the council of unit owners, and a statement as to whether or not they are to be part of the common elements; 2425(11) A statement as to whether streets within the condominium are to 26be dedicated to public use or maintained by the council of unit owners; 27A statement of any judgments against the council of unit owners (12)28and the existence of any pending suits to which the council of unit owners is a party; 29(13) In the case of a condominium containing buildings substantially 30 completed more than 5 years prior to the filing of the application for registration under 31 § 11–127 of this title, a statement of the physical condition and state of repair of the 32major structural, mechanical, electrical, and plumbing components of the 33 improvements, to the extent reasonably ascertainable, and estimated costs of repairs 34for which a present need is disclosed in the statement and a statement of repairs

1 which the vendor intends to make. The vendor is entitled to rely on the reports of2 architects or engineers authorized to practice their profession in this State;

3 (14) A description of any provision in the declaration or bylaws limiting 4 or providing for the duration of developer control or requiring the phasing-in of unit 5 owner participation, or a statement that there is no such provision;

6 (15) If the condominium is one which will be created by the conversion 7 of a rental facility, a copy of the notice and materials required by §§ 11–102.1 and 8 11–137 of this title;

9 (16) A statement of whether the unit being purchased is subject to an 10 extended lease under § 11–137 of this title, or local law, and a copy of any extended 11 lease;

12 (17) A written notice of the unit owner's responsibility for the council of 13 unit owners' property insurance deductible and the amount of the deductible; and

14 (18) Any other information required by regulation duly adopted and 15 issued by the Secretary of State.

16 (d) (1) Following execution of a contract of sale by a purchaser, the vendor 17 may not amend any of the material required to be furnished by subsection (a) of this 18 section without the approval of the purchaser if the amendment would affect 19 materially the rights of the purchaser.

20 (2) Approval is not required if the amendment is required by any 21 governmental authority or public utility, or if the amendment is made as a result of 22 actions beyond the control of the vendor or in the ordinary course of affairs of the 23 council of unit owners.

(3) A copy of any amendments shall be delivered promptly to anypurchaser and to the Secretary of State.

(e) (1) Any purchaser may RESCIND IN WRITING THE CONTRACT OF
SALE, WITHOUT ANY LIABILITY ON THE PURCHASER'S PART, at any time [(i)]
within:

(I) 15 days following receipt of all of the information required
under subsection (b) of this section or the signing of the contract, whichever is later[;
and (ii) within], WITHOUT STATING ANY REASON; OR

32 (II) 5 days following receipt of the information required **TO BE** 33 **DELIVERED** under subsection [(d)] (D)(3) of this section [, rescind in writing the 34 contract of sale without stating any reason and without any liability on his part, and 35 he shall be entitled to the return of any deposits made on account of the contract] IF:

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1 1. THE PURCHASER HAS APPROVAL RIGHTS UNDER  $\mathbf{2}$ SUBSECTION (D)(1) OF THIS SECTION; 3 2. THE AMENDMENT AFFECTS MATERIALLY AND 4 ADVERSELY THE RIGHTS OF THE PURCHASER; AND 3.  $\mathbf{5}$ THE PURCHASER STATES IN WRITING THE 6 **REASON FOR RESCISSION.** 7 (2) A PURCHASER WHO RESCINDS IN WRITING A CONTRACT OF 8 SALE UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE ENTITLED TO THE RETURN OF ANY DEPOSITS MADE ON ACCOUNT OF THE CONTRACT. 9 IF THE PURCHASER'S APPROVAL OF AN AMENDMENT IS NOT 10 (3) 11 REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (D)(1) OF THIS SECTION, A PURCHASER MAY 12NOT RESCIND A CONTRACT OF SALE UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION. 13 14**[**(2)**] (4)** The return of any deposits held in trust by a licensed real estate broker to a purchaser under this subsection shall comply with the procedures 1516set forth in § 17–505 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article. 17SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the 18 General Assembly that this Act: 19 abrogate a holding of the Court of Special Appeals in Herlson v. RTS (a) 20Residential Block 5, LLC, 191 Md. App. 719 (2010); and 21(b) clarify that the right of a condominium unit purchaser to rescind a 22contract of sale when there is a change to the public offering statement only applies if 23the change materially and adversely affects the rights of the purchaser. 24SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 25October 1, 2012.

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
