FOR the purpose of lengthening the period of time that a school vehicle may be
operated in St. Mary's County, subject to certain requirements; and generally
relating to the length of operation of certain school buses in St. Mary's County.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- Article Education
- 14 7-804.

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(a) In this section, "school vehicle" has the meaning stated in § 11–154 of the
Transportation Article.

17 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraphs (2) and (3) of this subsection, 18 unless it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety standards, a 19 school vehicle may be operated for 12 years.

1 (d) If a school vehicle passes an inspection that is required under subsection 2 (c)(1) of this section:

3 (1) The inspection shall be valid in the county in which the inspection
4 was completed; and

5 (2) If ownership of the school vehicle is transferred to a person who 6 operates the school vehicle in a county in which school vehicles are authorized under 7 subsection (b)(2) of this section to be operated for 15 years, the inspection shall be 8 valid in that county for the length of time that the inspection would have been valid in 9 the county where the inspection was completed.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
October July 1, 2012.
