A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Plastic Bag Recycling Act**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain fees to be deposited in the State Recycling
4 Trust Fund; prohibiting a plastic carryout bag manufacturer from providing,
5 selling, or offering for sale a plastic carryout bag for use or distribution in the
6 State unless certain language is printed or displayed on the bag and the
7 manufacturer has registered with the Department of the Environment in a
8 certain manner; authorizing a plastic carryout bag manufacturer to fulfill
9 certain requirements of this Act in a certain manner; requiring a plastic
10 carryout bag manufacturer to register with the Department in a certain manner
11 and on or before a certain date; establishing a plastic carryout bag
12 manufacturer registration fee; requiring a plastic carryout bag manufacturer to
13 develop and implement a certain plan in accordance with certain requirements;
14 providing that each plastic carryout bag manufacturer is responsible for all
15 costs associated with the development and implementation of its plan; requiring
16 the Department to deposit certain fees in the State Recycling Trust Fund;
17 requiring the Department, within a certain time period, to post on its Web site a
18 certain plan and notice of a certain comment period; requiring the Department
19 to review a certain plan; authorizing the Department to comment on a certain
20 plan; requiring a plastic carryout bag manufacturer to accept certain comments
21 on a certain plan and to respond, revise, and resubmit the plan under certain
22 circumstances; determining when a certain plan shall be considered final;
23 requiring each plastic carryout bag manufacturer, on or before a certain date, to
24 establish a certain educational program and develop and make available to
25 retailers certain educational materials; beginning on a certain date, requiring
26 each plastic carryout bag manufacturer to establish goals to include a certain
27 percentage of recycled content in plastic carryout bags it manufactures for use
28 or distribution in the State by a certain year; prohibiting a retailer, distributor,
29 or wholesaler, beginning on a certain date, from purchasing plastic carryout
30 bags from certain manufacturers; requiring the Department to maintain and

1 post on its Web site, beginning on a certain date, certain lists; requiring a
2 plastic carryout bag manufacturer to submit a certain annual report to the
3 Department; providing that a county or municipality is not prohibited from
4 adopting certain ordinances, resolutions, regulations, or rules under certain
5 circumstances; establishing certain penalties for certain violations; providing for
6 the recovery of the penalties in certain civil actions; requiring that certain civil
7 penalties be deposited into a certain fund; requiring the Department to adopt
8 certain regulations; defining certain terms; requiring the Secretary of the
9 Environment to submit a certain report to the General Assembly on or before a
10 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to
11 the recycling of plastic carryout bags.

28 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
29 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

30 **Article – Environment**

31 9–1701.

32 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

33 (b) “Compost” means the product of composting in accordance with the
34 standards established by the Secretary of Agriculture under § 6–221 of the Agriculture
35 Article.

36 (c) “Composting” means the controlled biological decomposition of organic
37 waste material in accordance with the standards established by the Secretary under
38 this title.

1 (d) (1) “Computer” means a desktop personal computer or laptop
2 computer, including the computer monitor.

3 (2) “Computer” does not include:

4 (i) A personal digital assistant device;

5 (ii) A computer peripheral device, including:

6 1. A mouse or other similar pointing device;

7 2. A printer; or

8 3. A detachable keyboard.

9 (e) (1) “Covered electronic device” means a computer or video display
10 device with a screen that is greater than 4 inches measured diagonally.

11 (2) “Covered electronic device” does not include a video display device
12 that is part of a motor vehicle or that is contained within a household appliance or
13 commercial, industrial, or medical equipment.

14 (f) “Covered electronic device takeback program” means a program,
15 established by a covered electronic device manufacturer, for the collection and
16 recycling, refurbishing, or reuse of a covered electronic device labeled with the name of
17 the manufacturer or the manufacturer’s brand label, including:

18 (1) Providing, at no cost to the returner, a method of returning a
19 covered electronic device to the manufacturer, including postage paid mailing
20 packages or designated collection points throughout the State;

21 (2) Contracting with a recycler, local government, other manufacturer,
22 or any other person; or

23 (3) Any other program approved by the Department.

24 (g) “Director” means the Director of the Office of Recycling.

25 **(H) “DISTRIBUTOR OR WHOLESALER” MEANS A PERSON WHO BUYS OR**
26 **OTHERWISE ACQUIRES PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAGS FROM ANOTHER SOURCE AND**
27 **PROVIDES, SELLS, OR OFFERS TO SELL THE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAGS TO A**
28 **RETAILER DOING BUSINESS IN THE STATE.**

29 **[(h)] (I)** “Manufacturer” means a person that is the brand owner of a
30 covered electronic device sold or offered for sale in the State, by any means, including
31 transactions conducted through sales outlets, catalogs, or the Internet.

1 **[(i)] (J)** (1) “Natural wood waste” means tree and other natural
2 vegetative refuse.

3 (2) “Natural wood waste” includes tree stumps, brush and limbs, root
4 mats, logs, and other natural vegetative material.

5 **[(j)] (K)** (1) “Natural wood waste recycling facility” means a facility
6 where recycling services for natural wood waste are provided.

7 (2) “Natural wood waste recycling facility” does not include a collection
8 or processing facility operated by:

9 (i) A nonprofit or governmental organization located in the
10 State; or

11 (ii) A single individual or business that provides recycling
12 services for its own employees or for its own recyclable materials generated on its own
13 premises.

14 **[(k)] (L)** “Office” means the Office of Recycling within the Department.

15 **(M) “PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG” MEANS A PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG**
16 **PROVIDED BY A RETAILER TO A CUSTOMER AT THE POINT OF SALE.**

17 **(N) “PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER” MEANS THE PRODUCER**
18 **OF A PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG THAT IS PROVIDED, SOLD, OR OFFERED FOR SALE**
19 **TO A RETAILER DOING BUSINESS IN THE STATE.**

20 **[(l)] (O)** “Recyclable materials” means those materials that:

21 (1) Would otherwise become solid waste for disposal in a refuse
22 disposal system; and

23 (2) May be collected, separated, or processed and returned to the
24 marketplace in the form of raw materials or products.

25 **[(m)] (P)** (1) “Recycling” means any process in which materials that
26 would otherwise become solid waste are collected, separated, or processed and
27 returned to the marketplace in the form of raw materials or products.

28 (2) “Recycling” includes composting.

29 **[(n)] (Q)** “Recycling services” means the services provided by persons
30 engaged in the business of recycling, including the collection, processing, storage,
31 purchase, sale, or disposition of recyclable materials.

1 **[(o)] (R)** “Resource recovery facility” means a facility in existence as of
2 January 1, 1988 that:

3 (1) Processes solid waste to produce valuable resources, including
4 steam, electricity, metals, or refuse–derived fuel; and

5 (2) Achieves a volume reduction of at least 50 percent of its solid waste
6 stream.

7 **(S) “RETAILER” MEANS A PERSON ENGAGED IN THE BUSINESS OF**
8 **MAKING SALES AT RETAIL THAT GENERATE SALES AND USE TAX REVENUE.**

9 **[(p)] (T)** (1) “Solid waste stream” means garbage or refuse that would,
10 unless recycled, be disposed of in a refuse disposal system located in this State.

11 (2) “Solid waste stream” does not include:

12 (i) Hospital waste;

13 (ii) Rubble;

14 (iii) Scrap material;

15 (iv) Land clearing debris;

16 (v) Sewage sludge; or

17 (vi) Waste generated by a single individual or business and
18 disposed of in a facility dedicated solely for that entity’s waste.

19 **[(q)] (U)** (1) “Video display device” means an electronic device with an
20 output surface that displays or is capable of displaying moving graphical images or
21 visual representations of image sequences or pictures that show a number of quickly
22 changing images on a screen to create the illusion of motion.

23 (2) “Video display device” includes a device that is an integral part of
24 the display and cannot easily be removed from the display by the consumer and that
25 produces the moving image on the screen.

26 (3) A video display device may use a cathode–ray tube (CRT), liquid
27 crystal display (LCD), gas plasma, digital light processing, or other image–projection
28 technology.

29 **[(r)] (V)** “White goods” includes:

- 1 (1) Refrigerators;
- 2 (2) Stoves;
- 3 (3) Washing machines;
- 4 (4) Dryers;
- 5 (5) Water heaters; and
- 6 (6) Air conditioners.

7 **[(s)] (w)** (1) “Yard waste” means organic plant waste derived from
8 gardening, landscaping, and tree trimming activities.

9 (2) “Yard waste” includes leaves, garden waste, lawn cuttings, weeds,
10 and prunings.

12 (f) (1) There is a State Recycling Trust Fund.

13 (2) The Fund shall consist of:

14 (i) The newsprint recycling incentive fee;

15 (ii) The telephone directory recycling incentive fee collected
16 under § 9–1709 of this subtitle;

17 (iii) The covered electronic device manufacturer registration fee
18 collected under § 9–1728 of this subtitle;

19 (iv) The mercury switch or mercury switch assembly removal
20 fees collected under § 6–905.4(c)(6)(iii)3 of this article;

21 **(v) THE PLASTIC BAG MANUFACTURER REGISTRATION FEE**
22 **COLLECTED UNDER § 9–1735 OF THIS SUBTITLE;**

23 **[(v)] (vi)** All fines and penalties collected under this subtitle
24 and under §§ 6–905.4 and 6–905.6 of this article;

25 **[(vi)] (vii)** Money appropriated in the State budget to the Fund;
26 and

27 **[(vii)] (viii)** Any other money from any other source accepted for
28 the benefit of the Fund.

4 9-1733.

5 A PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER MAY NOT PROVIDE, SELL, OR
6 OFFER FOR SALE A PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG FOR USE OR DISTRIBUTION IN THE
7 STATE UNLESS:

8 (1) THE NAME OF THE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER
9 IS PRINTED OR DISPLAYED ON THE BAG IN A MANNER READILY IDENTIFIABLE
10 TO THE CONSUMER; AND

11 (2) THE MANUFACTURER HAS REGISTERED WITH THE
12 DEPARTMENT AS REQUIRED UNDER THIS PART.

14 EXCEPT FOR SUBMISSION OF THE REGISTRATION FORM AND FEE
15 REQUIRED BY § 9-1735(A)(1) AND (2) OF THIS PART, A PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG
16 MANUFACTURER MAY FULFILL THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS PART
17 INDIVIDUALLY OR IN PARTICIPATION WITH OTHER PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG
18 MANUFACTURERS OR SUBCONTRACTORS.

27 THEREAFTER BY THE FIRST DAY OF THE MONTH IN WHICH THE INITIAL

5 **IMPLEMENTED, INCLUDING PROVISIONS FOR:**

6 1. **COLLECTION, STORAGE, TRANSPORT, AND**
7 **PROCESSING;**

8 2. **COLLECTION LOCATIONS;**

9 3. **RELATED PROMOTIONS AND EVENTS; AND**

10 4. **ANY OTHER INVOLVED PERSONS;**

11 **(II) MAY INCLUDE INFORMATION RELATING TO ANY**
12 **AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER AND A**
13 **RETAILER;**

14 **(III) DESCRIBES THE PERFORMANCE MEASURES TO BE USED**
15 **TO DOCUMENT EFFORTS TO COLLECT AND RECYCLE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAGS;**

16 **(IV) INCLUDES THE DEVELOPMENT OF EDUCATIONAL**
17 **MATERIALS TO ENCOURAGE REUSE, RECYCLING, AND REDUCTION IN THE USE**
18 **OF PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAGS; AND**

19 **(V) INCLUDES THE MAILING ADDRESS OR ELECTRONIC**
20 **MAIL ADDRESS OF THE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER.**

21 **(B) EACH PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER SHALL BE**
22 **RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE DEVELOPMENT AND**
23 **IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PLAN REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS**
24 **SECTION.**

25 **(C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL:**

26 **(1) DEPOSIT ANY FEES COLLECTED UNDER SUBSECTION (A)(2)**
27 **OF THIS SECTION IN THE STATE RECYCLING TRUST FUND ESTABLISHED UNDER**
28 **§ 9-1707(F) OF THIS SUBTITLE;**

29 **(2) WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER RECEIVING A PLAN REQUIRED BY**
30 **SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, POST ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEB SITE THE**

1 PLAN AND NOTICE OF A 30-DAY PERIOD FOR THE SUBMISSION OF WRITTEN
2 COMMENTS ON THE PLAN TO THE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER;
3 AND

4 (3) REVIEW EACH PLAN REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS
5 SECTION.

6 (D) THE DEPARTMENT MAY COMMENT ON A PLAN REQUIRED BY
7 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.

8 (E) A PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER WHO HAS DEVELOPED
9 A PLAN REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL:

10 (1) ACCEPT WRITTEN COMMENTS REGARDING THE PLAN DURING
11 THE 30-DAY PERIOD FOLLOWING POSTING OF THE PLAN AND NOTICE ON THE
12 DEPARTMENT'S WEB SITE; AND

13 (2) WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER RECEIPT OF ANY COMMENTS:

14 (I) RESPOND IN WRITING TO EACH PERSON SUBMITTING
15 COMMENTS; AND

16 (II) REVISE THE PLAN, IF APPLICABLE, AND SUBMIT THE
17 REVISED PLAN TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR POSTING ON THE DEPARTMENT'S
18 WEB SITE.

19 (F) A PLAN REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE
20 CONSIDERED FINAL:

21 (1) AT THE END OF THE 30-DAY COMMENT PERIOD IF NO
22 COMMENTS ARE SUBMITTED REGARDING THE PLAN WITHIN THAT PERIOD; OR

23 (2) AFTER THE PLASTIC CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER
24 RESPONDS IN WRITING TO ALL COMMENTS THAT ARE SUBMITTED REGARDING
25 THE PLAN WITHIN THE 30-DAY COMMENT PERIOD AND, IF APPLICABLE,
26 SUBMITS A REVISED PLAN TO THE DEPARTMENT.

7 **CARRYOUT BAG MANUFACTURER TOOK TO ENCOURAGE PLASTIC BAG**
8 **RECYCLING, INCLUDING ANY RECYCLING CAMPAIGNS, PROMOTIONS, AND**
