2 Natural Resources – Boating – Disclosure of Personal Information

3 FOR the purpose of <u>repealing a requirement that an owner of a certain vessel submit a</u> 4 written request to the Department of Natural Resources to prohibit the Department from disclosing certain information to any person; narrowing the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 prohibition against and exception for the disclosure of certain records held by 7the Department of Natural Resources by applying the prohibition and exception 8 only to personal information about the owner of a registered vessel; clarifying 9 the application of certain exceptions to the prohibition under certain circumstances against the Department disclosing certain personal information 10 about an owner of a registered vessel; and generally relating to disclosure of 11 12 records held by the Department of Natural Resources.
