4FOR the purpose of reducing the period of time that certain individuals at least a $\mathbf{5}$ certain age who hold a learner's instructional permit are required to wait before 6 taking certain examinations for a provisional driver's license; establishing that 7certain driving practice requirements and a requirement to complete a certain 8 driver skills log book before taking certain examinations for a provisional 9 driver's license do not apply to an individual at least a certain age; and 10 generally relating to driver education requirements for obtaining a provisional driver's license. 11
