4 5 6 7	"Any person who knowingly [and] OR willfully presents a false or fraudulent claim for payment of a loss or benefit or who knowingly [and] OR willfully presents false information in an application for insurance is guilty of a crime and may be subject to fines and confinement in prison."
8 9	(2) The lack of the statement required by paragraph (1) of this subsection does not constitute a defense in any legal proceeding.
10	(c) Subsection (b)(1) of this section does not apply to:
11	(1) reinsurance applications or claim forms; or
12 13 14	(2) the uniform claims form for reimbursement of hospital services or the uniform claims form for reimbursement of health care practitioners services adopted by the Commissioner under § 15–1003 of this article.
