4 (3) (i) Within 60 days after holding a casino event that includes a 5 card game or roulette, the holder of the permit for the event shall submit to the 6 Department of Permits and Development Management a financial report that lists the 7 receipts and expenditures for the casino event.

8 (ii) Before the permit holder submits the report to the 9 Department of Permits and Development Management, the permit holder shall submit 10 the report to the county police department for review.

11 (d) (1) The Department of Permits and Development Management shall 12 adopt regulations to govern:

13 (i) the issuing of a permit to conduct a casino event; and

(ii) the conduct and management of a casino event in a mannerdesigned to prevent fraud and protect the public.

16 (2) The regulations shall require that a separate permit be issued for 17 each casino event to be conducted.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
19 October 1, 2012.
