(a) The Department of Education in consultation with the Department of
Health and Mental Hygiene shall adopt regulations requiring a physical examination
for children entering the Maryland Public School System for the first time.

(b) The regulations shall require each child entering the Maryland Public
School System for the first time to have a physical examination INCLUDING A
CALCULATION OF THE CHILD'S BODY MASS INDEX, completed within:
