16 17	(a) Except as provided under Title 9, Subtitle 3 of this article, during any regularly scheduled primary or general election a voter may vote:				
18	(1) in the voter's assigned precinct on election day; or				
19 20	(2) at an early voting center in the voter's county of residence on any early voting day in accordance with this section.				
21 22	(b) (1) Each county shall have at least one early voting center established in the county as prescribed in this subsection.
