A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Video Lottery Operation Licenses – Information on Payouts**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that regulations adopted by the State Lottery
4 Commission include provisions that require certain payouts above certain
5 amounts be reported to the State Lottery Agency in a report that contains
6 certain information; requiring that the State Lottery Agency modify the report
7 in a certain manner and forward the modified report to the Department of
8 Human Resources' Child Support Enforcement Administration for certain
9 purposes; and generally relating to video lottery terminal payouts and the
10 holding of a video lottery operation license.

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 **Article – State Government**

4 9–1A–24.

5 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the Commission shall
6 ensure that a video lottery operation licensee complies with the requirements of this
7 section as a condition of holding the video lottery operation license.

8 (f) In order to protect the public interest, the regulations shall include
9 provisions that:

10 (1) limit the number and location of and maximum withdrawal
11 amounts from automated teller machines;

12 (2) require payouts above an amount adopted by the Commission to be
13 made by check;

14 **(3) REQUIRE THAT PAYOUTS MADE BY CHECK ABOVE AN AMOUNT**
15 **ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSION BE REPORTED TO THE STATE LOTTERY AGENCY**
16 **IN A REPORT THAT CONTAINS THE NAME AND DATE OF BIRTH OF AN INDIVIDUAL**
17 **AND THE AMOUNT OF THE PAYOUT;**

18 **[(3)] (4)** require conspicuous disclosures related to the payout of
19 video lottery terminals;

20 **[(4)] (5)** limit the dollar amount that video lottery terminals will
21 accept;

22 **[(5)] (6)** prohibit the use of specified negotiable instruments at video
23 lottery facilities and the use of credit cards, debit cards, and similar devices in video
24 lottery terminals;

25 **[(6)] (7)** provide consumers with a record of video lottery terminal
26 spending levels if marketing measures are utilized that track consumer spending at
27 video lottery facilities;

28 **[(7)] (8)** prohibit consumers from cashing paychecks at video lottery
29 facilities; and

30 **[(8)] (9)** prohibit video lottery operation licensees from engaging in or
31 contracting with another to engage in predatory marketing practices.

1 **(H) (1) ON RECEIPT OF THE REPORT REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION**
2 **(F)(3) OF THIS SECTION, THE STATE LOTTERY AGENCY SHALL MODIFY THE**
3 **REPORT TO INCLUDE ONLY THE NAMES OF INDIVIDUALS WHO HAVE BEEN**
4 **CERTIFIED TO THE STATE LOTTERY AGENCY BY THE CHILD SUPPORT**
5 **ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN**
6 **RESOURCES AS OBLIGORS WHO ARE IN ARREARS OF THEIR CHILD SUPPORT**
7 **ORDERS.**

8 **(2) THE STATE LOTTERY AGENCY SHALL FORWARD THE**
9 **MODIFIED REPORT TO THE CHILD SUPPORT ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION**
10 **OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES FOR THE PURPOSE OF**
11 **ENFORCING CHILD SUPPORT ORDERS ISSUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE**
12 **APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF THE FAMILY LAW ARTICLE.**

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
14 October 1, 2012.
