 certain members of the deceased officer's family or to the deceased officer's
 estate; authorizing a law enforcement agency to render the handgun of a
 deceased officer inoperable before transfer; and generally relating to the
 disposal of handguns by law enforcement agencies.

 - 18 (a) In this section, "manufacturer" has the meaning stated in § 5–131(a)(2) of
 19 this article.
 - 20 (b) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A 21 law enforcement agency seeking to dispose of a handgun owned by the agency shall:
 - 22

(1) destroy the handgun;

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 19October 1, 2012.
