CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Local States of Emergency – Time Period – Extension**

3 FOR the purpose of altering a certain time period that a local state of emergency may
4 continue or be renewed without the consent of the local governing body; and
5 generally relating to declarations of local states of emergency.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article – Public Safety**

14 14–111.

15 (a) Only the principal executive officer of a political subdivision may declare
16 a local state of emergency.

17 (b) (1) Except with the consent of the governing body of the political
18 subdivision, a local state of emergency may not continue or be renewed for longer than
19 **[7] 30** days.

1 (2) An order or proclamation that declares, continues, or terminates a
2 local state of emergency shall be:

3 (i) given prompt and general publicity; and

4 (ii) filed promptly with the chief local records-keeping agency.

5 (c) Declaration of a local state of emergency:

6 (1) activates the response and recovery aspects of any applicable local
7 state of emergency plan; and

8 (2) authorizes the provision of aid and assistance under the applicable
9 plan.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 2012.
