Public Schools - Epinephrine Availability and Use - Policy Requirements

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring each county board of education to establish a policy to 4 authorize certain school personnel to administer auto-injectable epinephrine to 5 certain students under certain circumstances; requiring a certain policy to 6 include certain information; providing that a certain policy may authorize a 7 school nurse to obtain and store at a public school auto-injectable epinephrine 8 for certain purposes; requiring certain public schools to submit a certain report 9 to the State Department of Education; requiring the Department to develop and 10 disseminate a certain standard form; defining certain terms; and generally relating to an epinephrine availability and use policy in public schools. 11

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effectively 1, 2012.
(2) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP AND DISSEMINATE STANDARD FORM TO REPORT EACH INCIDENT REQUIRING THE USE OF AUTO-INJECTABLE EPINEPHRINE AT A PUBLIC SCHOOL.
