## Criminal Procedure - Custody of Arrested Persons Before Release

- FOR the purpose of requiring a police officer to keep custody of an arrested person from the time of arrest until the person is committed by lawful authority to a State or local correctional facility, released from custody, or in the custody of another police officer; requiring authorizing a correctional employee officer assigned to monitor supervise and transport inmates to keep custody of or provide transport for certain arrested persons under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the custody of arrested persons.
