3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Public Works to approve economic inclusion 4 plans for certain State procurement contracts; requiring that economic inclusion 5 plans be drafted by certain contractors in collaboration with certain units and 6 local community groups; requiring that economic inclusion plans promote the 7 involvement and training of certain minority business enterprises, locally 8 owned businesses, and local residents; requiring that economic inclusion plans 9 include certain procedures, policies, and processes; requiring certain units to determine certain definitions by considering certain factors; requiring the Board 10 to adopt certain regulations; requiring certain units to waive certain 11 12 requirements for economic inclusion plans under certain circumstances; 13 requiring certain bidders, offerors, or contractors to carry out certain economic inclusion plans in good faith; requiring certain units to make certain 14 determinations; providing that certain penalties apply under 15 16 circumstances; and generally relating to the Board of Public Works, 17 procurement contracts, and economic inclusion plans.
