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Public Schools - Student Attendance - Preventing Chronic Absenteeism

3 FOR the purpose of requiring certain schools to maintain a record of the daily 4 attendance of certain students using a certain identifier, to calculate and 5 maintain a certain record of certain student attendance information, and to 6 submit a certain report to the county board of education that includes certain 7 student attendance information at certain times each year; requiring each 8 county board of education to calculate and maintain a certain record of certain 9 attendance information; requiring each county board to report certain information to the State Board of Education at least a certain number of times 10 each year; requiring each county board to develop and implement a certain 11 12 attendance incentive action plan that includes certain information; defining 13 certain terms; and generally relating to tracking and reporting student attendance in public schools. 14
