9	(f) Except as provided in subsection (g) of this section, the following individuals may practice as a physician assistant without a license:
11 12 13	(1) A physician assistant student enrolled in a physician assistant educational program that is accredited by the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant or its successor and approved by the Board; or
14 15	(2) A physician assistant employed in the service of the federal government while performing duties incident to that employment.
16 17 18	(g) A physician may not delegate prescriptive authority to a physician assistant student in a training program that is accredited by the Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant or its successor.
19 20 21 22 23	(h) (1) If a medical act that is to be delegated under this section is a part of the practice of a health occupation that is regulated under this article by another board, any rule or regulation concerning that medical act shall be adopted jointly by the State Board of Physicians and the board that regulates the other health occupation.
