17 18 19 20 21	(b) [Except for a financial transaction necessary to preserve a person's right to representation as guaranteed by the 6th Amendment to the United States Constitution and Article 21 of the Maryland Declaration of Rights, a] A person may not, with the intent to promote a drug crime or with the intent to conceal or disguise the nature, location, source, ownership, or control of proceeds of a drug crime:
22 23	(1) receive or acquire proceeds knowing that the proceeds are derived from a drug crime;

- 1 (2) engage in a financial transaction involving proceeds knowing that 2 the proceeds are derived from a drug crime;
- 3 (3) give, sell, transfer, trade, invest, conceal, transport, or maintain an interest in proceeds knowing that the proceeds are derived from a drug crime;
- 5 (4) direct, promote, plan, organize, initiate, finance, manage, 6 supervise, or facilitate the transportation or transfer of proceeds knowing that the 7 proceeds are derived from a drug crime; or
- 8 (5) conduct a financial transaction involving proceeds knowing that 9 the proceeds are derived from a drug crime.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
