19 20 21	(a) An individual who has the human immunodeficiency virus may not knowingly transfer or attempt to transfer the human immunodeficiency virus to another individual.



- 1 (b) A person who violates the provisions of this section is guilty of a [misdemeanor] FELONY and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$2,500] \$10,000 or imprisonment not exceeding [3] 25 years or both.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 2012.
