4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11	FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "human service facility" to include certain kidney dialysis centers for purposes of certain provisions of law requiring a human service facility to develop a certain emergency plan providing that a human service facility is solely responsible for certain financial obligations arising from certain activations of a certain emergency plan; requiring the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to adopt certain regulations on on before a certain date in consultation with representatives of certain entities; and generally relating to emergency plans for human service facilities.

17 18	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

21 22	(a) In this section, "human service facility" means a facility licensed by the State that is:
23 24	(1) a nursing home, as defined in § 19–1401 of the Health – General Article;

3	(3) a hospital, as defined in § 19–301 of the Health – General Article;
$\frac{4}{5}$	(4) a related institution as defined in § 19–301 of the Health – General Article;
6	(5) a State-operated institution for mental disease;
7	(6) a group home as defined in § 7–101 of the Health – General Article
8 9	(7) an alternative living unit as defined in § 7–101 of the Health – General Article; [and]
10 11	(8) a State residential center as defined in § 7–101 of the Health – General Article; \mathbf{AND}
12 13	(9) A KIDNEY DIALYSIS CENTER AS DEFINED IN § 19–3B–01 OF THE HEALTH – GENERAL ARTICLE.
14	(b) A human service facility shall develop an emergency plan.
15 16	(c) An emergency plan shall include procedures that will be followed before during, and after an emergency to address:
17 18	(1) the evacuation, transportation, or shelter—in—place of individual served by the human service facility;
19 20 21	(2) the notification to families, staff, and licensing authoritie regarding the action that will be taken concerning the safety and well-being of th individuals served by the human service facility;
22 23	(3) staff coverage, organization, and assignment of responsibilities and
24	(4) the continuity of operations, including:
25	(i) procuring essential goods, equipment, and services; and
26	(ii) relocation to alternate facilities.
27	(D) A HUMAN SERVICE FACILITY IS SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR AN

3 4 5	[(d)] (E) (1) On or before November 30, 2007, a State agency that is responsible for the licensing of a human service facility shall adopt regulations governing the development of emergency plans under this section.
6 7	(2) Regulations adopted under paragraph (1) of this subsection shall be developed in consultation with representatives of:
8	(i) the Maryland Emergency Management Agency;
9	(ii) the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems;
1	(iii) local organizations for emergency management; and
12	(iv) human service facilities.
13 14 15	[(e)] (F) For purposes of coordinating local emergency planning efforts, a human service facility shall provide access to the emergency plans developed under this section to local organizations for emergency management.
16 17 18	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1, 2013, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall adopt regulations governing the development of emergency plans by kidney dialysis centers subject to Section 1 of this Act, in consultation with representatives of:
20	(1) the Maryland Emergency Management Agency;
21	(2) the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems;
22	(3) local organizations for emergency management; and
23	(4) kidney dialysis centers.
24 25	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2012.
