18 19 20 21	WHEREAS, Falls are among the most serious and common problems that threaten the independence and quality of life of senior citizens and are a strong predictor of whether a senior citizen will need to be placed in a skilled–nursing facility and
22 23	WHEREAS, Falls are the leading cause of injury-related hospitalization and outpatient visits among senior citizens in Maryland; and
24 $25$	WHEREAS, In 2009, 43,855 senior citizens were hospitalized or received hospital outpatient care for falls;



1 2 3	WHEREAS, Of the 581 fall—related deaths reported in 2009 in Maryland, 434 or 78 percent, were adults who were at least 65 years old, which is more than double the cases reported in 2000; and
4 5	WHEREAS, Hospitalization charges for treating senior citizens in Maryland who fell totaled over \$130 million in 2009; now, therefore,

11 12 13 14 15	IN RECOGNITION OF THE NEED FOR INCREASED AWARENESS OF THE EFFECT THAT FALLS HAVE ON THE SENIOR CITIZENS OF MARYLAND, THE GOVERNOR EACH YEAR SHALL PROCLAIM THE WEEK THAT BEGINS ON THE FIRST SUNDAY THAT FALLS AFTER THE AUTUMNAL EQUINOX AS FALL PREVENTION AWARENESS WEEK.
16 17	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before January 1 2013, the Secretary of Aging and the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene shall:
