## A BILL ENTITLED

2 Alcoholic Beverages – Queen Anne's County – Beer and Wine Festivals

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Queen Anne's County Board of License
- Commissioners to issue a certain number of Beer and Wine Festival (BWF) licenses in the county each year; authorizing the Board to select a certain
- 6 number of weekends each year for a certain festival; requiring the Board to
- 7 choose a certain location for a certain festival and to assure that the primary
- 8 focus of a certain festival is the promotion of certain beer and wine; altering a
- 9 certain definition; and generally relating to beer and wine festivals in Queen
