1 IS GIVEN TO NATURAL BOUNDARIES AND THE BOUNDARIES OF POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly determines that the amendment to the Maryland Constitution proposed by this Act affects multiple jurisdictions and that the provisions of Article XIV, § 1 of the Maryland Constitution concerning local approval of constitutional amendments do not apply.

8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the aforegoing section 9 proposed as an amendment to the Maryland Constitution shall be submitted to the 10 qualified voters of the State at the next general election to be held in November, 2012 for their adoption or rejection pursuant to Article XIV of the Maryland Constitution. 11 12 At that general election, the vote on this proposed amendment to the Constitution 13 shall be by ballot, and upon each ballot there shall be printed the words "For the 14 Constitutional Amendment" and "Against the Constitutional Amendment," as now 15 provided by law. Immediately after the election, all returns shall be made to the Governor of the vote for and against the proposed amendment, as directed by Article 16 17 XIV of the Maryland Constitution, and further proceedings had in accordance with 18 Article XIV.
